

YMCAs across New York State are currently offering 243 childcare programs for infants, toddlers, pre-school and school-age children. That accounts for about 6% of the licensed centers in New York State.¹

The YMCA isn't just about quantity; it's about quality. Through our non-profit status, New York's YMCAs are able to offer over \$10 million a year in financial aid and scholarships for childcare. The YMCA charges less for childcare than the New York State average and pays our dedicated childcare staff more.
