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1 AN ACT TO : Make it mandatory for all school employees to have CPR-B training.

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3 ***The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate***
4 ***and Assembly, do enact as follows:***

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6 **PURPOSE:** We initiate this bill as a way to make anyone on the school grounds and the
7 educational setting safer.

8 **SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS :**

9 Section 1: Definitions

10 Premises: A building surrounded by property that is owned by the company/owner of the building.

11 Mandate: An official order

12 CPR-B: Training for use of AED, CPR for children, infants, and adults.

13 Section 2:

14 (1) All New York State Public school employees will be mandated to take a CPR-B class. The
15 employees could have the certification to help and saved children, infants, and adults on the
16 premises of the school.

17 (2) These CPR classes will be good for 2 years, and each class are around 5 hours long.

18 **JUSTIFICATION:**

19 70% of injury related deaths are children age 6-19 years old. 25% of those injuries occur in the
20 school setting. Enacting this law can lower this number, saving lives, and make a safer school
21 community for everyone. School should be a place for learning and obtaining new information and
22 we shouldn't have to worry about the safety of students. More staff having the information of
23 something as simple as CPR-B could go a long way for the health of students. This would be one
24 less thing parents would have to worry about when sending their children to school. 90% of
25 people who suffer out-off-hospital cardiac arrest die, if CPR is performed in the first few minutes
26 it can double and even triple a persons chance of living. Giving the staff this training can give
27 them the chance to help and save lives in the school. If an employee really cares about their job
28 and the students that attend their school, they would take the time to take a training to save
29 lives.

30 **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:** The classes are around \$30. The staff would pay for the first class and
31 the district would pay for the sequential trainings.

32 **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This bill will go in affect at the beginning of the academic school year following
33 its passage.
