AN ACT TO: Mandate New York State schools have bullet proof windows and doors.

The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

PURPOSE: We initiate this bill as a way to protect the students and adults in the public, educational setting, in the event that one or more active shooters are on the premises.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS:

- Bullet proof: designed to resist the penetration of bullets
- 12 Public school: A tuition free school in New York State supported by taxes and controlled by the
- 13 state school board
- 14 Active shooter: an individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined
- and populated area; in most cases, active shooters use firearm(s)
- 16 Section 2
- 17 (1) All New York State schools will be mandated to replace 100% of interior and exterior windows
- and doors with bullet proof material by 2027.
- 19 (2) Within each New York State public school district, the superintendent, board of education, and
- 20 community members of that district, will collectively determine who their district will contract to
- 21 replace non-bullet-proof windows and doors. Community members, who are registered voters and
- 22 live within district, may cast their vote for one of the contractors (minimum of two) that the
- 23 superintendent and board of education have selected as competent and fiscally responsible
- 24 contracting options.
- 25 (3) Each New York State district will be required to reserve and budget funds to cover the cost of
- 26 replacement.

JUSTIFICATION:

- 28 Since 2010, there have been more than 119 deaths, in the United States, due to school shootings.
- 29 This does not include the number of individuals who have been injured as a result of such
- 30 shootings. As of June 2016, New York State schools are now required to provide training that
- 31 includes preparation for a school shooting. Many teachers and school districts express concerns
- 32 about having inadequate training for such an event. For districts, adequate, anual training will
