- Amend Section 101 of the Education Law, by adding sub-section 115 to eliminate the Common Core standards from New York State.
- Amend Section 341 of the Education Law by adding sub-subsection f, to eliminate New York State standardized testing in grades 3-5
- Amend N.Y. SOS. LAW I 413: NY Code - Section 413: and require a thorough investigation of any accused persons before their names are placed on record.
- Amend I 23-1101 of Article 23 of the Environmental Conservation Law to prohibit oil and gas drilling leases on all state-owned lands in New York State.
- Amend Section 600 of the Vehicle and Traffic law to increase the penalties for leaving the scene of an accident.
- Amend Section 3309 of New York State Public Health Law, to add subsection 5 to have police officers administer Narcan.
- Add subsection (6) to I155.7 of the New York State Education Law to require a silent alarm and "buzz-in" system to be installed in school entrances
- Amend section 9121, subsection I of the Unconsolidated Laws to fine those individuals who do not leave a mandatory evacuation zone.
- Electronic System for the submission of Bills
- Allow military court cases to be tried in the United States court system.
- Amend section 2801 of the Education Law, sub-section f, to mandate that all persons have photo identification to enter schools.
- Add Section 215-d to General Provisions of the Labor Law (Article 7) to make it illegal for employers to take retaliatory personnel action solely based on the discovery of sexually explicit images of said employee, which were disseminated via the internet without their knowledge or consent.
- Amend Section 409 of the New York State Education Law to mandate carbon monoxide detectors in all schools
- Amend Section 130.30 of the New York State Penal Code of rape in the 2nd Degree to allow for the age of sexual consent between the ages of 14 and 17 years old.
- Amend I 502 subsection 1, of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law to mandate fingerprinting when renewing or receiving a driver's license for the first time.
- Add section S27-0709 to amend the Environmental Conservation Law, in relation to the disposal and source of recyclable materials; prohibits transporters from commingling recyclables with other materials; prohibits incinerators and landfills from accepting recyclables.
- Amend section 50.20 of Criminal Procedure law extending the protections of immunity from prosecution to petit jury cases conjunctively extending the right to grant such immunity to defense attorneys.

- Amend Article 139, subsection 6902, of the New York State Education Law to distribute condoms to teens at high schools
- Amend Section 1399-n of the NYS Public Health Law, adding electronic cigarettes to the definition of smoking.
- Amend Section 140.20 of the New York State Criminal Procedure Law to mandate the collection of DNA from arrestees at point of arrest through oral swab tests.
- Add subdivision (f) to the mental hygiene law I33.21 in order to ban licensed counselors from attempting to change a minor's sexual orientation.
- Amend Family Court Law section 3581A reform the current CPS system to provide an increased level of care to children who suffer from abuse.
- Amend Section 442 of the Social Services Law by adding subsection A to: Mandate the NYS Office of Children and Family Service to provide annually three post-adoptive check-ups for all foster care children in the span of 5 years.
- Reform the Quinnipiac Poll procedure of measuring public opinion by reducing the current 3 percent margin of error, so an accurate reflection of public opinion is presented.
- Add section 2(a) of the Penal Law 70.8 to chemically castrate repeat sex offenders who assault people under the age of 18 years old.
- Amend Section 2781 of the Public Health Law to mandate STD and HIV testing for rape victims
- Amend I502, subsection 1, of the Vehicle and Traffic Law to allow undocumented immigrants to obtain a driver's license.
- Amend Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act to include protections for unpaid interns
- Provide suffrage rights for felons in NYS who are released from prison and on parole
- Amend S 250.55 of the New York State Penal Code to ban the distribution of revenge pornography.
- Amend I 4 of Article 3 of the New York State Constitution to stipulate that no school district be contained by more than one Assembly and one Senate district.
- Amend Family Court Act section 458-d to freeze the assets of non-custodial parents whom owe \$15,000 in child support arrears.
- Allow students with special needs to skip the Committee process of issuing the Individual Evaluation Test, leaving the decision to a parent/ teacher process
- Acts that protects safe drivers from unsatisfactory drivers due to impairments, injures, physical obstacles, diseases, accidents, et al),
- To give unemployed people a way to earn their government aid by providing a service while providing training and experience for the people placed in these programs.
- Convert the use of school textbooks into the modern technology of tablets.

- Amend Penal Code Sections 130.25-130.35 Purpose to increase the punishment for those found guilty of rape.
- Amend Section 100.2, subsection m, of Part 100 of the Commissioners to initiate a grading policy reform where the pre-existing No-Zero policy will be replaced with the a system where school reports must show accurate grades earned, ranging from 0-100
- Amend I270 of the Public Health Law to allow for terminally ill patients to use experimental drugs not yet approved by the Food and Drug Administration.
- Amend Section 125.20 of the New York State Penal Law by adding subsection 5, to eliminate the homosexual panic defense
- Amend Article 5 of the NYS Executive Law, by adding subsection 63-E to grant the Attorney General authority to act as a special prosecutor in cases involving crimes committed by police officers in NY.
- Amend executive law I 22 state disaster preparedness plans subsection 3. recovery; add subsection 4: to create official New York State disaster relief fund to permit the NYS Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services to create an official New York State Disaster Relief Fund.
- Amend I 83 of Article 4-c of the New York State Public Building Law to change the requirements for new buildings and renovations so that New York States becomes a leader in Green Building and energy conservation.
- Amend I220.43 of the NY State Penal Law to establish Cloud 9 as a controlled substance. The purpose of this bill is to establish Cloud 9 as a controlled substance and make the sale of this drug illegal in NY.
- Amend Article VI of the NY State Constitution to put the public defense system in the hands of the State. The purpose is to replace the disorganized and underfunded county-based system of public defense with a functional system run by NY State with adequate funding, standards and supervision.
- Amend I1225-c of New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, subsection 4, to require repeat offenders of texting and driving have a program installed on their phone to stop the functioning of their cellular devices except in emergencies.
- Amend Section Four of Article 1352-b of New York State Public Health Law to require all persons employed by a food service establishment to obtain a First Aid and CPR/AED certification as part of their employee training.
- Amend I 353: NY Code - Section 353: Overdriving, torturing and injuring animals; failure to provide proper sustenance. Abuse and killing of animals is ethically wrong, and the punishments regarding these types of situations are not handled correctly. The classifications of these crimes should be changed from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class C.
- NYS Tax Article 22 I 606 To Incentivizing solar panels will help to decrease greenhouse gas emissions in NY

- Amend Section 4607 of the Education Law to require educational programs for homeless individuals. to provide education to people in homeless shelters, so that they can become qualified for a specialized career that will allow them more economic and social freedoms, and from that will come opportunities that would not arise without these positive educational contingencies.
- Amend Section 130.53 of the Penal law to increase the penalty for persistent sexual abuse from a class E to a class B felony.
- Amend Section 2 of the New York State Education Law, to mandate concussion testing for all high school students participating in any sport.
- Amend section 5130.45 of the New York State general law to increase the penalty for criminal sexual act in the second degree. To increase the penalty for a second degree criminal sexual act from a class D felony to a class B felony.
- Amend Section 154 of the NY State Correctional Law by adding work programs for prisoners who owe child support. This bill will take the already established work program for prisoners, and make it so a prisoner who is in arrears for child support must work off his debt by working in prisons.
- Amend NY Work Comp Law Sec. 201 (9) (B) making it possible for people to receive benefits while on family leave. The purpose of this bill is to give aid to employees who need to take care of medically related family matters for extended periods of time.
- Add Section 1229d to Article 33 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law to protect the health, safety, welfare and general well-being of all children under the age of 18 years it shall be illegal for any person(s) to use tobacco products that produce smoke while in a vehicle in the presence of a child.
- Amend I 1229-c: NY Code - section 1229: Operation of vehicles with safety seats and safety belts. The intended purpose of this bill is to require all persons in a motor vehicle must be wearing a commissioner approved seat belt to increase the safety of the persons in the vehicle.
- Add to the New York State Education Law, Article 17, Sections 804 Part 1 and 4c to guarantee that all high school students will be provided with a comprehensive education regarding domestic violence in previously mandated health courses
- Amend I 10 of Article II of the New York State Constitution The purpose of this bill is to implement a procedure in which any elected state official can be removed from office in the event that he or she is unable to sufficient represent the wishes of the citizens who elected the official.
- Amend Section 3343-a, sub-section2, of the Public Health law to restrict the number of narcotic painkillers. The purpose is to limit the illegal selling/distribution of narcotic painkillers and to decrease the number of overdoses by adding a cap on the maximum number of narcotic painkillers prescribed per patient per month.
- Amend I 135.3 of the New York State Health-related Requirements-Comprehensive Sex Education
- Amend Public Health Law II 4138-c; 4138-d to give adoptees the opportunity to know about their biological backgrounds at a more appropriate age.

- Amend Section N.Y. CPL. LAW I 2.10 sub-section 3a and create a third party to investigate incidents of alleged police misconduct.
- Amend I 135.3 of the New York State Education Law, subsection c, to mandate all secondary schools to teach sexual education. To mandate sex education to be taught in existing secondary health classes grades 7-12. The curriculum will include abstinence, contraceptive use and sexual consent
- Amend New York Criminal Prosecution Law I 60.42 to prohibit prosecutors in sex crimes from using the alleged victim's past prostitution convictions as evidence. To protect sex crime victims with past convictions of prostitution.
- Repeal New York Domestic Relations Article 8 to legalize the act of commercial surrogacy in NY.
- Amend Section 136 of the Correction Law by adding subsection a, to implement a work study program in state prisons.
- Amend the New York State Mental Hygiene Law Section 41.49 by adding Subsection 8, to establish the Collaborative Education for Suicide Prevention in Schools ("CESPS") establishing the necessary programming to mandate comprehensive risk-prevention and health-promotion training to school personnel in NY State schools to ensure that school personnel develop the skills and confidence necessary to intervene with at-risk youth, recognize suicide risk, and understand and utilize the referral process for mental health services and support.
- Amend Education Law I3012-c to increase the emphasis placed on personal observations in the Annual Professional Performance Review guidelines, and to decrease the emphasis of standardized testing scores and S.L.O. growth in teacher evaluations.
- Amend school law article 28 section 11 to require four lockdown drills and three fire drills in both the spring and fall. To provide necessary knowledge on how to act efficiently in emergency lockdown situations to prevent casualties in the event of an actual shooting.
- Amend Section 391-o of the General Business Law to prohibit the sale of powdered caffeine to minors
- Amend I100.5 of the New York State Education Law to bring Language Other Than English to fifth grade students. Our bill intends to bring LOTE to students in grade five.
- Amend Section 140.50, sub-section 1 of the Criminal Procedure Law to mandate the use of body worn video cameras for police officers.

- Amend Section 511.1 (b)(1-a) to classify all adult dance performers as an employee.
- Add subsection 2 and 3 to I 902 of Article 19 of the New York State Medical and Health Service Law to require a social worker be employed at every high school and to instate a 0.1% increase on state sales tax
- Amend I 111-A of Article 7 of the Domestic Relations Law in order to prevent unjust parental rights of rapists to include third degree rape.

- Amend I 135.3 subsection B of the New York health education law to educate fifth grade females about feminine hygiene
- Amend I 400.00, subsection 10 B, of The New York State Penal Code to require civilian smart handgun technology in all handguns when renewing one's license.
- Amend I 447 to decriminalize minors' involvement in the act of prostitution.
- Amend I 5-212 of the New York State of Motor Vehicle Law to automatically register recipients of driver's licenses and those renewing their driver's licenses to vote.
- Amend I 70.15 of Article 70 of the Penal Law Sentences of Imprisonment for Misdemeanors and Violation to abolish imprisonment for Class B misdemeanors or lower in New York State.
- Amend I 803 of Article 17 of the Education Law in order to implement rape aggression defense courses in all high schools in New York State.
- Amend I 9.29 of The New York State Mental Hygiene Law: Involuntary admission on medical \_\_\_ certification; notice of admission to patients and others to include information regarding condition and \_\_\_treatment of the hospitalized.
- Amend I10.11 of the Mental Hygiene Law to mandate the Global Positioning System tracking of level 2 and 3 sex offenders for the remainder of their sentence as a condition of parole.
- Amend I3635-b of Article 73 Part 3 of the New York State Education Law to require the addition of flashing LED lights on all road signs signaling a school zone area.
- Amend Art 32-A I677 of the General Business Law to install wheelchair ramps in public buildings and to add subsection 2 to instate a temporary 0.04% increase on state sales tax
- Amend Article 100.5 Section 7 of the New York State Education Law in order for students to have the opportunity to graduate with honors in Social Studies and English on a New York State Regents Diploma.
- Amend Article 157 –by adding section 8007, creating a healthier meal plan for state funded schools.
- Amend Article 17A of the Vehicle and Traffic Law section 5490, to grant undocumented residents in New York State driver licenses.
- Amend Article 2 Section 13 of the Education Law Law to mandate safety ratings in all higher education institutions.
- Amend Article 2-B of the Banking Law to add Section 78A to require mandatory reporting by financial institutions of suspected abuse of an elder or dependent adult to Adult Protective Services and to provide civil immunity for such reporting.
- Amend New York Correction Law I 611 subsection 2 of Births to inmates of correctional institutions and care of children of inmates of correctional institutions
- Amend New York Environmental Conservation Law I 33-1301 to ban Carbaryl, Cypermethrin, and Malathion from being used in schools and residential areas, and establish a fee for the use of those chemicals
- Amend New York State Education Law Article 19 I 917-2
- Amend New York State Executive Law I837-f to provide that New York State Missing Child Prompt Response and Notification Plans provide for a minimum twenty-four (24) hour period for broadcast and electronic messaging following the issuance of an Amber Alert.
- Amend New York State Judiciary Law Article 16, Section 519 to require private employers to provide employees to be paid jury duty leave.
- Amend New York State TAX law Article 28 part 3 I 1116 to add subdivision (10) to section (a) in order to exempt taxes on small businesses for the first thirty-six months they are in operation.

- Amend Section 100.10 Education Law to require people who are interested in homeschooling to have at least a high school diploma or a GED.
- Amend Section 131-k.2 of Social Service Law by eliminating sanctuary policies in New York State.
- Amend Section 2601-4 of the New York State Education Law to require a majority vote in favor of passing a school budget to raise the property tax cap in that district, in the event that the budget is voted down the first time.
- Amend Section 30.10, subsections (b) and (e), of the Criminal Procedure Law to increase the statute of limitations for rape and sexual conduct in the second and third degrees.
- Amend Section 342 of the Social Service Law, by adding sub-section 7 to require a maximum limit of sixty months of welfare benefits.
- Amend Section 390-b, subsection 3, of the New York State Social Services Act to improve the background checks of foster parents, as well as including mental health examinations.
- Amend Section 801 of the New York State Education Law to require a curriculum unit on 9/11 in grades 8-12.
- Amend Section 5198-c of the New York State Labor Law to implement a paid time off model for workers in New York State.
- Amend the Public Housing Law to add section 223-C in relation to prohibiting smoking on the premises of public housing units.
- Amend the tax law, in relation to establishing a credit for geothermal energy systems.
- Amend Title 5, Article 19, Section I 503 of Vehicle and Traffic Law to require drivers in NYS to retake the driving portion of their 3rd license renewal.
- Amends paragraph 4 of subsection 1 of section 210 of the Tax law to lower the entire Net Income Tax for small businesses in New York State.
- Require that the amount of state prison time be decreased for those convicted of minor, drug related offences and that alternative rehabilitation be an option if addiction is an issue with the offender.
- RESOLUTION – Members of the Assembly urges the Legislature of the State of New York to allow permanent residents to vote in county board, school board, school budget, and city council elections.
- To expand section 1 I4310 of the New York State Public Health Law to combine the 1999 Life Pass It On Organ Registry with the 2006 Donate Life Organ Registry to create one list governed by the laws of the Donate Life registry.
