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An Act To

- 4 Amend §912-b. of speech and language improvement services to require the
- 5 education of American Sign Language to students in grades K-6.
- 6 The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

7 Purpose

- 8 The purpose of this bill is to require American Sign Language to be taught in
- 9 schools with a graduating class size of greater than one hundred in grades K-6.

10 **Summary of Provisions**

- 11 <u>Section 1:</u>
- 12 Speech and language improvement services.
- 13 1. The board of education or trustees of each school district and the city school
- 14 district of the city of New York may must provide speech and language
- 15 improvement services to students in grades kindergarten through six with speech
- 16 impairments of a severity that does not adversely affect the student's
- 17 educational performance but does present a barrier to communication.
- 18 2. Any student, who is determined to be in need of such speech and .language
- 19 improvement services, shall receive such, upon the recommendation of the
- 20 building administrator.
- 21 3. A student, whose speech impairment adversely affects the student's educational
- 22 performance shall be referred to the committee on special education for further
- 23 evaluation and recommendation for special education services and programs,
- 24 pursuant to article eighty-nine of this
- 25 Chapter.
- 4. All students in school districts with a cohort of greater than one hundred total
- 27 students shall receive American Sign Language classes in grades kindergarten
- 28 through six.

29 **Justification**

- 30 By requiring the education of ASL to young students, the hearing and deaf
- 31 communities would be able to better communicate with each other, erasing
- 32 boundaries in job opportunities. Teaching students at a young age will also help
- 33 students learn the language faster and will promote equality between the deaf and
- 34 hearing communities.

35 Fiscal Implications

- 36 The cost of this bill will be different for each district, however, we anticipate a less
- 37 than one percent increase in the district's budget.

38 **Effective Date**

39 This bill will go into effect twelve months after passage.
