- 4 Amend § 190.25 of the New York State penal law to include and specify precincts
- 5 regarding phishing and any type of online impersonation
- 6 The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

### 8 Purpose

- 9 The purpose of this bill is to strengthen the laws against false impersonation and10 decrease online identification fraud.
- 11

### 12 Summary of Provisions

- 13 <u>Section 1: Definitions</u>
- 14 Phishing: the fraudulent practice of sending emails, texts, social media applications,
- 15 <u>websites, accounts, or calls</u> purporting to be from reputable companies or a certain
- 16 <u>individual or account</u> in order to induce individuals to reveal personal information,
- 17 such as passwords and credit card numbers, <u>or to exploit an individual sexually or</u>
- 18 <u>financially.</u>
- 19 <u>Section 2:</u>
- 20 § 190.25 Criminal impersonation in the second degree.
- 21 A person is guilty of criminal impersonation in the second degree when he:
- 22 1. Impersonates another and does an act in such assumed character with
- 23 intent to obtain a benefit or to injure or defraud another; or
- 24 2. Pretends to be a representative of some person or organization, either online or
   25 <u>in person</u>, and
- 26 does an act in such pretended capacity with intent to obtain a benefit
  27 or to injure or defraud another; or
- 28 3. (a) Pretends to be a public servant, or wears or displays without
- authority any uniform, badge, insignia, logo, or facsimile thereof by which
- 30 such public servant is lawfully distinguished, or falsely expresses by
- 31 his words or actions that he is a public servant or is acting with
- 32 approval or authority of a public agency or department; and (b) so acts
- 33 with intent to induce another to submit to such pretended official
- 34 authority, to solicit funds or to otherwise cause another to act in
- 35 reliance upon that pretense.
- 36 4. Impersonates another by communication by internet website or
- 37 electronic means with intent to obtain a benefit or injure or defraud
- another, or by such communication pretends to be a public servant in
- order to induce another to submit to such authority or act in reliance) on suchpretense.
- 41 Criminal impersonation in the second degree is a class A misdemeanor.
- 42 <u>5. Any person who knowingly uses another's name, voice, signature, photograph or</u>
- 43 <u>likeness through social media to create a false identity without such person's</u>

44 consent, or in the case of a minor the consent of his or her parent or legal

- 45 guardian, for the purpose of harming, intimidating, threatening or defrauding such
- 46 person, shall be liable for online impersonation and liable for any damages
- 47 <u>sustained by the person or persons injured as a result thereof; creating a false</u>
- 48 <u>identity in order to obtain a benefit or to injure or defraud another.</u>49

#### 50 Justification

- 51 It is necessary for this bill to be amended due to the sweeping number of victims of
- 52 identity theft/ fraud in the United States. In 2016, some 15.4 million internet
- 53 consumers were victims of such crime. Online thieves stole \$16 billion, with the
- 54 mean fraud amount per victim amounting to \$1,038. By strengthening the law and
- 55 closing major loopholes, less criminals will slip by unscathed by the law.

#### 57 Fiscal Implications

58 The only fiscal implication of this bill is the amount of money saved by reduction of

59 fraud/identity theft.60

### 61 Effective Date

62 This bill will go into effect one year after passage.
