- 2 An Act To Have a nurse's overtime pay begin after 40 regularly scheduled hours per
- 3 7 day work week under Subsection 2 of Section 167 of NYS labor laws.
- 4 The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:
- 5 **Purpose**
- 6 The purpose of this bill is to limit how nurses can be overworked by employers and
- 7 give nurses a set standard for their working hours.
- 8 **Summary of Provisions**
- 9 Section 1
- 10 a. "Health care employer" shall mean any individual, partnership, association,
- 11 corporation, limited liability company or any person or group of persons acting
- directly or indirectly on behalf of or in the interest of the employer, which provides
- 13 health care services (i) in a facility licensed or operated pursuant to article twenty-
- eight of the public health law, including any facility operated by the state, a political
- subdivision or a public corporation as defined by section sixty-six of the general
- 16 construction law , or (ii) in a facility operated by the state, a political subdivision or
- 17 a public corporation.
- 18 b. "Nurse" shall mean a registered professional nurse or a licensed practical nurse
- 19 as defined by article one hundred thirty-nine of the education law who provides
- 20 direct patient care.
- 21 c. "Regularly scheduled work hours", including pre-scheduled on-call time and the
- 22 time spent for the purpose of communicating shift reports regarding patient status
- 23 necessary to ensure patient safety, shall mean those hours a nurse has agreed to
- 24 work and is normally scheduled to work pursuant to the budgeted hours allocated
- 25 to the nurse's position by the health care employer.
- 26 Section 2
- 27 2. a. Notwithstanding any other provision of law no health care employer shall
- 28 require a nurse to work more than that nurse's regularly scheduled work hours up
- 29 to forty hours there after receiving overtime pay during a 7 day time period, except
- 30 pursuant to subdivision three of this section.
- 31 **Justification**
- 32 Nurses are constantly being overworked without being recognized. Many
- 33 occupations currently have set standards for their working hours. These including
- 34 less labor intensive jobs. The current bill regulates employers of not enforcing
- 35 mandatory overtime hours, our bill looks to send a standard for these hours.
- 36 Fiscal Implications
- 37 This bill would altering the income of nurses, most likely increasing their pay due to
- 38 them currently being overworked. This would not change where the funds for a
- 39 nurses pay would come from but increase this pay for the increase in labor.
- 40 **Effective Date** This bill will go into effect one year after its passage.
