<u>An Act To:</u> amend section 210 of the Taylor law; allowing public employees or employee organizations, excluding policemen and firemen, to cause, instigate, encourage or go on strike.

The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

<u>Purpose:</u> To prevent the exploitation of public sector workers by allowing them to strike and advocate for their fair treatment while protecting public safety.

Summary of Provisions

- 13 <u>Section 1: Definitions</u>
- 14 Public sector union: A trade union which primarily represents the interests of
- 15 <u>employees within public sector or governmental organizations.</u>
- 16 Strike: Refusal to work organized by a body of employees as a form of protest,
- 17 <u>typically in an attempt to gain a concession or concessions from their employer.</u>
- 18 Section 2:
- 19 1. No public employees or employee organizations shall have the right to engage in
- 20 a strike, instigate, encourage, or condone a strike. Firefighter and police employee
- 21 organizations shall not be granted the right to engage in a strike, instigate,
- 22 encourage, or condone a strike and will be subject to the penalties laid out in the
- 23 <u>Taylor law if they go on strike.</u>
