**Summary of Provisions**

**Section 1: Definitions**

A list of the most vital vocabulary words that have a different legal definition than dictionary definition. Words not already defined by New York Law should be underlined, any word or part of a definition being removed should be struck through.

Strikethrough: Alt + shift + 5

## Section 2:

The exact specifications of what your bill will do. Section 2 references specific lines of existing law, utilizes strikethroughs to illustrate where parts of the law may be removed and underlines to demonstrate where new parts of the law will be added.

## **Justification**

An original paragraph of roughly 4-8 sentences citing the logic and reasoning behind the bill. The justification should contain statistics, studies, quotes, or any other substance to demonstrate author research and statewide importance.

## **Fiscal Implications**

A description of the financial or monetary effects of the bill. Explain whether there are no implications, minor implications, or major implications. Specify whether this bill will increase state revenue, require an allocation of funds, require an increase in taxes, or save consumers money.

## **Environmental Implications**

A description of the effects your bill will have on the environment. Similar to the Fiscal Implications section, explain whether this bill will have a large, minimal, or nonexistent effect on New York State wildlife.

## **Effective Date**

When the bill will be enforced. Usually either immediately, one year after passage, or a specific date, written in the format "June 10, 1990". A more complex bill that requires greater financial commitment will take more time to enforce, a bill entailing a simple name change or addition of a definition could have a shorter time before enacting it.
