An Act To

Amend section 7 of the State Finance Law 99-bb to mandate New York State public schools to use the school-based health centers fund to establish outside mental

6 health services in schools.

The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

<u>Purpose</u>

- 11 To make it mandatory for all public school systems in the state of New York to use
- 12 funds for mental health resources in the form of an outside professional, not
- 13 associated with the school and its district or system of schools.

Summary of Provisions

- 16 Section 1: Definitions
- 17 Outside services: it is a catchall term for tasks you paid independent contractors to
- 18 perform. The tasks you hire out to independents certainly qualify for this deduction.
- 19 Mental health: a person's condition with regard to their psychological and emotional
- 20 <u>well-being.</u>
- 21 Section 2:
- 22 § 99-bb. School-based health centers fund. 1. There is hereby established in the
- 23 joint custody of the comptroller and the commissioner of health, a special fund to
- 24 be known as the "school-based health centers fund".
- 25 7. Services performed by school-based health centers available for moneys from
- 26 this fund shall include, but not be limited to:
- 27 a. comprehensive physical health and mental health assessments;
- 28 b. diagnosis and treatment of acute illnesses;
- 29 c. vision, hearing, dental, nutritional, and tuberculosis screenings;
- 30 d. routine management of chronic diseases;
- 31 e. health education;
- 32 f. mental health counseling and referrals;
- 33 g. immunizations;
- 34 h. working papers and sports physicals; and
- i. population-based primary prevention.
- 36 j. Funding for mandatory outside mental health services in public schools

37 **Justification**

Mental health institutions are necessary for all public schools as a safe passageway for children's mental health. Many students struggle with mental health in their everyday life and do not feel comfortable sharing sensitive information with a school professional. With an outside resource inside the school but not directly affiliated with the school system, there is a chance that more outreach will occur to students for treatment as well as the relationship between the student and the new service solely for the purpose of treatment and support for the student, and no other interests in the situation.
