5 An act to amend Article 27 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law by adding 6 subsection 30 to ban the use of single use plastic products.

The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

10 **Purpose**

- 11 To ban the purchase of certain single-use plastics by all agencies and departments, which are
- 12 fully or partially funded by the state of New York.
- 13

14 Summary of Provisions

- 15 <u>Section 1:</u> Definitions
- 16 Single use plastics: Containers made from plastic which are intended for use only once before
- 17 they are thrown away or recycled.
- 18 <u>Corporation: a company or group of people authorized to act as a single entity (legally a person)</u>
- 19 and recognized as such in law.
- 20 Firm: A firm is a commercial enterprise, a company that buys and sells products and/or services
- 21 to consumers with the aim of making a profit.
- 22 Limited Liability Company: A limited liability company (LLC) is a corporate structure in the
- United States whereby the owners are not personally liable for the company's debts or
 liabilities.
- 25 <u>Medical Condition: A medical condition is a broad term that includes all diseases, lesions, and</u>
- 26 <u>disorders.</u>
- 27 Fully or Partially funded by the state of New York: Government funding refers to financial
- 28 assistance received by non government entities in the form of federal, state, or local
- 29 government grants, loans, loan guarantees, property, cooperative agreements, food
- 30 <u>commodities, direct appropriations, or other assistance.</u>
- 31 Section 2: Summary of Provisions
- 32 1. No person, firm, partnership, association, limited liability company or corporation shall sell or
- 33 offer for sale or provide to any person in the state any single-use plastic products.
- 34 <u>2. This section shall not apply to:</u>
- 35 (A) The purchase of plastic straws for a person requiring such straws due to a medical
- 36 condition; and
- 37 (C) Single-use plastic medical equipment.

39 Justification

- 40 This bill would greatly decrease the mass production of single use plastics, which are a huge
- 41 detriment to the environment, the oceans, and wildlife. This would put New York at the forefront
- 42 of pollution reduction caused from single use plastic production. Single use plastic produced
- 43 would be required to be recyclable, or compostable. Altogether, this would greatly reduce waste,

44 and fossil fuels associated with single use plastics, targeting the manufacturers that are fully or

- 45 partially funded by New York, rather than the consumer. Compostable plastic helps save water
- 46 by allowing the soil to hold moisture and reduce water runoff. It benefits the environment by
- 47 recycling organic resources while conserving landfill space. When single use plastics are thrown
- 48 out, harmful chemicals and greenhouse gasses are released from rubbish in landfill sites they
- 49 end up in. Recycling helps to reduce the pollution caused by waste.

51 **Fiscal Implications**

- 52 According to The World Economic Forum, reuse and recycle measures would actually <u>reduce</u>
- 53 packaging costs by at least \$8 billion a year, savings that could potentially be passed onto
- 54 consumers and also go towards efforts to save the environment.

56 Enviornmental Implications

- 57 This bill will have a large, and beneficial impact on the environment, allowing New York State
- 58 wildlife to flourish. When plastics are intended for one time use, they are quickly discarded,
- 59 which can easily hurt not only marine life in NYS, but also wildlife. By having all plastics
- 60 produced become recyclable or compostable, the likelihood of its interference with wildlife will
- 61 decrease. Also, less plastic will be produced, accounting for less harmful fossil fuels.

63 Effective Date

- 64 This bill will go into effect 1 year after passage, including a 6 month grace period for
- 65 manufacturers.
