3 An Act To

Amend § 27-1005 of the Environmental Conservation law to raise the deposit on
plastic bottles from 5 cents to 10 cents per bottle.

The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

- 9 **Purpose** To promote more people to recycle and reduce the detrimental impact
- 10 that global warming and pollution have on the earth that we live on.
- 11

12 Summary of Provisions

- 13 <u>Section 1: Definitions</u>
- 14 Beverage container- the individual separate bottle, can, jar, carton, or other
- 15 receptacle, however denominated, in which a beverage is sold, and which
- 16 <u>constructed of metal, glass, or plastic, or other material, or any other combination</u>
- 17 <u>of these materials.</u>
- 18 Deposit initiator- the first bottler, distributor, dealer or agent to collect the deposit
- 19 <u>on a beverage container sold in New York State.</u>
- 20 Refund value- the price at which the issuing company may choose to repurchase a
- 21 <u>security before its maturity date.</u>
- 22 <u>Reverse vending machine- device that accepts used (empty) beverage containers</u>
- 23 and in return gives the user money back.
- 24 Pollution- presence or introduction of a thing or substance that harms the
- 25 <u>environment around it.</u>
- 26 Six pack rings- connected plastic rings that hold beverage containers (usually
- 27 <u>cans/bottles) together.</u>
- 28 <u>Section 2:</u>
- 29 § 27-1005. Refund value.
- 30 No person shall sell or offer for sale a beverage container in this state unless the
- 31 deposit on such beverage container is or has been collected by a registered deposit
- 32 initiator and unless such container has a refund value, gross refund due, of not less
- 33 than five ten cents, which is clearly indicated thereon as provided in section 27-
- 34 1005 of this title.35

36 Justification

- 37 Today one of the biggest issues we face as a society is the pollution that WE are
- 38 creating due to neglect and ignorance to the impact we have on our earth. Pollution
- 39 causes environmental devastations such as global warming, melting of the polar ice
- 40 caps, and the destruction of the ozone layer. This is destroying our earth and
- 41 something has to be done, so that is what we are working to do. By passing our bill

- 43 people recycling then there will be less litter on the streets and in the ocean.

45 Fiscal Implications

- 46 This bill will increase the cash deposit upon purchase of a plastic bottle from 5 cents47 to 10 cents. With the use of a reverse vending machine the consumer has an
- 48 opportunity to obtain 10 cents back from a plastic bottle purchase.

50 Enviornmental Implications

- 51 Recycling rates will increase, which means land pollution rates will decrease due to
- 52 less plastic waste in landfills and on the side of the road.

54 Effective Date

55 This bill will go into effect one year after its passage.
