3 An Act To

Amend section § 4402 of the Education Law by implementing mental health days
into New York State public schools.

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The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

9 Purpose

- 10 To allow students diagnosed with severe anxiety, depression or other mental health
- 11 issues to take off five excused days of school within each three month period of the
- 12 school year to recover and better cope with their illnesses.

14 Summary of Provisions

- 15 <u>Section 1: Definitions</u>
- 16 <u>Mental Illness: A wide range of conditions that affect mood, thinking, and behavior.</u>
- 17 Anxiety Disorder: A mental health disorder characterized by feelings of worry,
- 18 anxiety, or fear that are strong enough to interfere with one's daily activities
- 19 Depression: A mental health disorder characterized by persistently depressed mood
- 20 or loss of interest in activities, causing significant impairment in daily life.
- 21 <u>Section 2: Provisions</u>
- 22 Education Law § 4402 Upon their child's enrollment or attendance in a public
- 23 school, such school shall notify every parent or person in parental relation of their
- 24 ights regarding referral and evaluation of their child for the purposes of special
- education services or programs pursuant to applicable federal and state laws,
- 26 <u>including in severe cases where the child requires services due to their mental</u>
- 27 <u>health state, such as days off</u>. Such notification be provided by directing parents or
- persons in parental relation to obtain information located on the department's
 website relating to a parent's guide to special education in New York State for
- 30 children ages three through twenty-one provided the notification shall also
- 31 contain the name and contact information for the chairperson of the school
- 32 district's committee on special education or other individual who is charged with
- 33 processing referrals to the committee in the district.

35 Justification

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- 36 The modern day school system asks a lot for our youth, children are expected to do
- 37 work from when they enter building to when they leave, and even after they leave
- 38 with homework, and all of this can cause stress. Now, think about the students who
- 39 are already in major stress over a disorder they cannot control, if we keep pushing
- 40 these students in particular more and more with work while already undergoing
- 41 problems, it can lead to their illness only getting worse and could possibly lead to



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42 them doing something dangerous. In 2017, 17.2 percent of high schoolers reported

43 seriously considering suicide, which is up by 25 percent since 2009, when just 13.8

44 percent of students reported seriously considering suicide. The rate of suicide

45 increased by 33 percent, from 7.5 to 10.0 suicides per 100,000 15- to 19-year-olds

46 from 2009 to 2016. Students with severe anxiety and/or depression need a day of

47 recovery for their own good, so they can focus more on calming their issues and

48 not feel like they're expected to run themselves into the ground.
