4 An Act To amend the New York State Constitution Article 3 Section 14.

5 The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

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37 38 **Purpose:** To grant citizens the direct opportunity to either approve or reject legislation.

- 15 No bill shall be passed or become a law unless it shall have
- 16 been printed and upon the desks of the members, in its final form, at
- 17 least three calendar legislative days prior to its final passage, unless
- 18 the governor, or the acting governor, shall have certified, under his or
- 19 her hand and the seal of the state, the facts which in his or her
- 20 opinion necessitate an immediate vote thereon, in which case it must
- 21 nevertheless be upon the desks of the members in final form, not
- 22 necessarily printed, before its final passage; nor shall any bill be
- passed or become a law, except by the assent of a majority of the 23
- 24 members elected to each branch of the legislature; and upon the last
- 25 reading of a bill, no amendment thereof shall be allowed, and the
- 26 question upon its final passage shall be taken immediately thereafter,
- 27 and the ayes and nays entered on the journal.
 - a. In the event that a bill receives the signatures of 5% of voters of the most recent governmental election, referendum will be justified to be presented on the statewide election ballot.

For purposes of this section, a bill shall be deemed to be printed and upon the desks of the members if: it is set forth in a legible electronic format by electronic means, and it is available for review in such format at the desks of the members. For purposes of this section "electronic means" means any method of transmission of information between computers or other machines designed for the purpose of sending and receiving such transmissions and which: allows the recipient to reproduce the information transmitted in a tangible medium of

expression; and does not permit additions, deletions or other changes to be made without leaving an adequate record thereof.

<u>Justification</u>

Today the civic duty of voting is often neglected because citizens feel as if their voice isn't being heard in legislation. By promoting statewide referendum, more citizens will be encouraged to vote, increasing the representation of the common citizen and furthering direct democracy. Controversial laws will be left to be decided upon by citizens rather than by representatives, who vote based on party preference.

Fiscal Implications

Each ballot costs 15 cents to print, a cost which is already accounted for through state budget. Around 400,000 dollars are spent each year to print statewide election ballots. Adding referendum to the ballot will not add any additional costs to the budget.

Effective Date

This bill will go into effect one year after passage.

Environmental Implications

This bill will have no further environmental implications due to the fact that ballots are already being printed for statewide elections annually.
