4	An Act To enforce fine and or incarceration for police officers who fail to abide by

6 7	The People of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:
8	The reopie of the State of New York, represented in the Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:
9	<u>Purpose</u>
10	The purpose of this bill is to enforce a fine and or incarceration to police officers and
11	correctional officers who fail to abide by the misconduct laws enforced by the
12	Department of Justice. This will ensure the safety of the public and those
13	incarcerated and allow for police officers and correctional officers to focus on
14	protecting the people as well as removing unjust officers from duty.

16	Summary of Provisions
17	Section 1
18	Incarceration: the state of being confined in prison; imprisonment.
19	Police Officers: A policewoman and policeman who are usually assigned to a specific
20	patrol area where they would be responsible to enforce the law. They respond to
21 22	emergencies, enforce traffic laws and would investigate complaints. Correctional Officer: Officers responsible for the custody, safety, security, and
23	supervision of inmates in a prison or any other correctional facility.
24	Section 2
25	75 U.S.C. §§ 3
26	Suspension pending determination of charges; penalties. Pending the
27	hearing and determination of charges of incompetency or misconduct, the
28	officer or employee against whom such charges have been preferred may be
29	suspended without pay for a period not exceeding thirty days. If this misconduct
30	is based on account of such person being an alien, or by reason of his color or race,
31	Shall be fined a minimum of \$750 or face incarceration at a minimum of 18
32	months. If such officer or employee is found guilty of the charges, the penalty
33	or
34	punishment may consist of a reprimand, a fine not to exceed one hundred
35	dollars to be deducted from the salary or wages of such officer or
36	employee, suspension without pay for a period not exceeding two months,
37	demotion in grade and title, or dismissal from the service; provided,

however, that the time during which an officer or employee is suspended



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without pay may be considered as part of the penalty. If he is acquitted, he shall be restored to his position with full pay for the period of suspension less the amount of any unemployment insurance benefits he may have received during such period. If such officer or employee is found guilty, a copy of the charges, his written answer thereto, a transcript of the hearing, and the determination shall be filed in the office of the department or agency in which he has been employed, and a copy thereof shall be filed with the civil service commission having jurisdiction over such position. A copy of the transcript of the hearing shall, upon request of the officer or employee affected, be furnished to him without charge.

3-a. Suspension pending determination of charges and penalties relating to police officers of the police department of the city of New York. Pending the hearing and determination of charges of incompetency or misconduct, a police officer employed by the police department of the city of New York may be suspended without pay for a period not exceeding thirty days. If such officer is found guilty of the charges, the police Commissioner of such department may punish the police officer pursuant to the provisions of sections 14-115 and 14-123 of the administrative code of the city of New York.

Justification

This bill is important because police officers and correctional officers are put in place to protect the public and to protect those who are incarcerated. However, as of recent events, police brutality is becoming the norm in our society. The brutality of inmates is a common act. This is unacceptable and something should be done about it. Many people are becoming fearful of the people that are meant to protect them. This bill will ensure that those who are wrongfully using their force and power to abuse the public rather than save needs to have a punishment of their own.

Fiscal Implications

For law enforcement who fail to abide by the misconduct laws enforced by the
Department of Justice in a minor way (punch, slap, or kick) that does not cause
severe damage will face a fine of \$750 dollars.
