Previous Youth and Government experience and/or other qualifications: I joined Youth and Government in my sophomore year, but even prior to then I was heavily involved in my student senate and debate club. Through hard work and dedication, I have had the honor of serving as the Vice President of my student senate as a junior, a position that presides over more than 4,000 students and is most often held by a senior. In addition, I have been lucky enough to be a state



semifinalist as well as a nationally ranked debater for the past two years.
